ROLE PROFILE

POST:

Recreation Area and Holiday Club Manager

SALARY:

£27,000-30,000 (dependent upon experience)

LOCATION:

Hammersmith & Fulham Youth Zone. Once the Youth Zone is open your place of work will be there. In the months prior to the Youth Zone opening (which is estimated to be at the end of 2023) you will be contracted to work in an office opposite the Youth Zone's site in Scale Space, White City.

The strength of OnSide comes from the diversity of the people within our vibrant network. We are proud that our Youth Zone teams reflect the communities they serve, and we value people working together from a range of different backgrounds, locally and nationally, and with different experiences, all with a shared passion for boosting the aspirations of young people across the country. Diversity brings innovation, fresh ideas and creativity, and we actively strive to create a culture that is truly inclusive and fair for all and where everyone in the team can be themselves and thrive.

THE ROLE

To manage WEST Youth Zone's open access recreational area during term time, and the Youth Zone's Holiday Club which runs all day, Monday to Friday during school holidays.

The 'Rec' is at the very heart of the Youth Zone, where every young person enters and spends time in at some point during every visit. This role will be responsible for creating a space that is warm, welcoming, active, full of life and challenge. Our Holiday Clubs give young people a place to go when they're on school holidays. This post holder will be responsible for creating a lively, dynamic, inspired and fun-loving 'rec' environment for all young people aged 8-19 (up to 25 for those with additional needs) year-round. During Holiday Cub they will be responsible for coordinating an exciting offer across the youth zone and acting as 'session lead'.

FIRST 12 MONTHS

In the first 12 months, you will have:

- Supported the Youth Zone to achieve 1000 visits by young people a week, inspired by the continually changing & vibrant offer
- Collaborated with the delivery team to ensure a vibrant & engaging programme is in place every session, planned 3 months in advance with input & cocreation with young people.
- Grown, recruited, developed & led the sessional delivery team to provide a supportive, safe, inclusive, and ambitious
 environment.
- Have developed strong local partnerships which result in direct benefit to the borough's young people.
- Introduced the OnSide evaluation framework alongside young people's feedback to enhance the quality of the support given to help young people's progression.
- Ensure volunteer & young leaders are well managed and supported.
- Delivered holiday clubs engaging 80 young people a session
- Plan & promote for holiday project delivered 13 weeks of the year



KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- · To manage the recreation area at WEST Youth Zone including appropriate outdoor areas
- · Plan a programme of activities to deliver a holiday scheme for out of term time for 13 weeks a year
- To work directly with children and young people to develop their social skills and build their confidence by delivering programmes of activities and services
- To provide line management support for a small team year round, and a larger team of 'seasonal' holiday club workers (support and training will be provided)
- To become one of a team of named Designated Safeguarding Leads, taking safeguarding responsibility for the session on which you are managing (further training is provided)
- As a line manager, approve, and confirm the hours staff have worked on each session via our electronic payroll system (training is provided)
- Think outside of the box when it comes to planning and delivering a vibrant programme of activities in the recreation area as this is the heart of both Senior & Junior sessions
- To have great energy to establish positive relationships with young people and the wider youth work team and visitors to the Youth Zone
- · To respond to the needs of the young people through activities in the recreation area
- · To support and motivate staff and volunteers working in the recreation area
- · Ensure there are solid boundaries in place and high level of good behaviour is in maintained
- To work flexibly to ensure the needs of the members are met, including disadvantaged children and young people and those with disabilities or additional needs
- To ensure the participation of young people in activities and that their ideas contribute fully in the delivery and evaluation of activities
- The role requires occasionally session leading and locking up of the Youth Zone to cover for Senior and Junior Club Leads. This will be scheduled by your Line Manager and you will be assigned another member of staff to assist
- · Manage, induct, train, support and develop a team of part time youth workers, play workers and volunteers to contribute to the programme development and delivery
- · To motivate, encourage and support young people to participate fully in sessions
- · To manage resources effectively to maximise the benefits to young people
- To develop effective joint working with schools and other agencies to ensure a holistic approach in service delivery to young people including representing the Youth Zone at meetings with partner agencies
- · To work with the Youth Zone staff to identify opportunities and funding for additional opportunities and experiences for young people
- To be alert to issues of safeguarding and child protection, ensuring the welfare and safety of Youth Zone members is promoted and safeguarded, and to report any child protection concerns to the designated Child Protection Officers using policies, procedures, and practice
- Comply with all policies and procedures, with particular reference to safeguarding, codes of conduct, health and safety and equality and diversity to ensure all activities are accessible
- · Be a role model for young people and present a positive "can do" attitude
- To assist with any promotional activities and visits that take place at the Youth Zone, positively contributing towards increasing Youth Zone membership
- To deputise for the Head of Youth Work as required & carry out any other reasonable duties as requested by the Senior Leadership Team
- · Carry out any other reasonable duties as requested by the Senior Leadership Team

WEST YOUTH ZONE

Hammersmith & Fulham is a neighbourhood of wide disparities, with an acute need for youth services. The north of the borough comprises many neighbourhoods in the 20% most deprived neighbourhoods in the UK, whereas in the south, many are in the least deprived. This vast difference between those living in different parts of our borough is hugely unfair and can lead to radically different life outcomes. WEST Youth Zone is a vital provision that will make a huge difference to the lives of young people, and to the whole borough, levelling the playing field for our young people.

Construction of Hammersmith & Fulham's Youth Zone, named "WEST" by local young people, is due to be completed at the end of 2023 and open in spring 2024 as the fourth OnSide Youth Zone in London. At WEST, we believe all young people in Hammersmith & Fulham should have the opportunity to discover their passion and their purpose. To find out what they've got and where it could take them. Our Youth Zone will be a purpose-built space fizzing with energy and crammed with incredible facilities. It will be staffed by skilled and dedicated youth workers who truly believe in young people in the city – helping them see what they could achieve, and giving them the skills, confidence and ambition to go for it.

Once open, we will deliver life-changing support to help thousands of young people from a diverse range of backgrounds to thrive.

Open 37 hours a week, 7 days a week, while schools are closed - that's evenings and weekends, plus all through the school holidays. We will offer a safe and active space for young people to flourish in their leisure time, where their interests can be nurtured, and they can grow as Individuals. Averaging 1,000 visits per week this is a charity that the whole community can be proud of, and you can be part of that journey.

Entry will be just 50p each visit and annual membership £5 which will give a young person access to over 20 activities per night. In addition to our open-access provision we will run targeted projects that bring specific outcomes to some of those most in need of additional support and interventions.

WEST Youth Zone will operate a proven OnSide model of youth service provision that is aligned to community needs and supported by cross-sector funding. We give 8–19 year-olds, (and up to 25 for young people with additional needs) affordable access to a broad range of sport, arts and employability services, designed to empower them to lead healthier, positive and more active lives – raising their aspirations for themselves and their community.

The split of age groups are: Juniors 8-12 year olds Seniors 13+

The facilities will be second to none, delivering sporting, artistic, cultural and general recreational activities each session. The outstanding quality of the facilities is a concrete demonstration of the belief that the young people of our community deserve the best.

ABOUT ONSIDE


